



## Notes

<ul> <li>The garbage bags from before the city merger and an old sticker cannot be used.</li> <li>Put into Myoko City's designated combustible garbage bags written in orange.</li> <li>When using old designated garbage bags, please buy a sticker and stuck on them.</li> <li>Long or big items should be cut down no bigger than 40cm.</li> <li>If the items are too large, either take them to the Arai Recycling Center or dispose of them as metal large plastic items.</li> <li>Dispose of used oil by soaking it up with cloth.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>The garbage bags from before the city merger and an old sticker cannot be used.</li> <li>Separate powder (ash) and fragments (broken china, glass).</li> <li>Wrap broken glass with paper and write "ガラス"on it.</li> <li>Items which contain asbestos must be wet thoroughly and disposed of separately. Label the bag with "石綿".</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Metal caps are classified as cans. Plastic caps are classified as other plastic packaging.</li> <li>Stained bottles, and broken bottles are classified as incombustible.</li> <li>Return beer, Sake (Japanese alcohol) or milk bottles to stores.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Plastic bottles not baring the PET symbol are Other Plastic Packages.</li> <li>Metal caps are "Cans" Plastic caps are Other Plastic Packages.</li> <li>Bottles which contained pesticides or are dirtied are combustible.</li> <li>PET bottles are also collected in front of super markets</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Sprays and gas cylinders must be empty. Be sure to remove the gas following the instruction.</li> <li>Containers which contained hardened contents as paint are classified as incombustible. If the layer remaining thin the container is classified as a can.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Items must not exceed the following dimensions: 1m×40cm×40cm and must be less than 15kg (capable to be carried by one person).</li> <li>Needles and nails should be placed in metal containers, such as cooking pots or empty cans to avoid scattering.</li> <li>Don't forget to remove batteries and fuel from heaters or stoves.</li> <li>Empty vacuum-cleaners (combustible waste) before disposal.</li> <li>The rules are equally applicable for large plastic items.</li> <li>Please dispose of small household appliances at the Arai Recycling Center.</li> </ul>



## NOTES

- It is not necessary to put fluorescent lights into packaging.
- Bring button cells and rechargeable batteries to designated boxes in stores. When disposing of the batteries put masking tape on the batteries' terminals.
- Put masking tape on the batteries terminals and put into a paper bag if it is difficult to bring button cells to Arai Recycling Center.
- Broken mercury thermometers and fluorescent tubes are incombustible.

THROWAWA Y CHOPSTICK S	Throwaway chopsticks, bamboo chopsticks, wooden ice cream spoons and sticks.	<ul> <li>Wash and dry them and bring them to the corresponding collection site.</li> <li>*Please refrain from using throwaway chopsticks. Throwaway chopsticks are collected free of charge and are recycled into paper in paper plants. The City appreciates your efforts in recycling them.</li> </ul>	
COTTON CLOTHES	Cotton products (containing more than 30%). Sheets, towels, clothes, T-shirts, denim (excludes briefs and panties).	<ul> <li>Please bring the washed items to the collection site.</li> <li>Does not include clothes made completely of chemical fibers, small cotton items (e.g. briefs, panties, handkerchiefs, socks, caps) and wool.</li> <li>X To promote recycling of cotton clothes, they are collected and processed into cleaning rags at the welfare workshop "Rindou no Sato". DISPOSABLE HEAT PADS	Used disposable heat pads	<ul> <li>Please place only used disposable heat pads into the container.</li> <li>Unused and unopened disposable heat pads can not be disposed of here.</li> <li>* Iron comprised in the pads serves as a nutrient for phytoplankton. The propagation of phytoplankton leads to the growth of seaweed and seaweed beds, which are habitats for fish. The amount of CO<sub>2</sub> absorbed by the photosynthesis done by phytoplankton and seaweed is said to be many times more than the CO<sub>2</sub> absorbed on land. Thus sustaining the ecosystem of the ocean serves as a measure against global warming. The drop-off of disposable heat pads is free of charge and the city appreciates you efforts for the environment.</li> </ul>	
ARTIFICIAL TEETH, DENTURES	Dentures, artificial teeth, bridges, fillings, crowns	<ul> <li>Sanitize dentures and artificial teeth in boiling water or with denture cleansers.</li> <li>Items have to be put in plastic bags available at the provided boxes.</li> <li>Dentures and artificial teeth without metal are classified as combustible.</li> <li>*False teeth will be handed over to the NPO "Hotto Myoko Takenoko Workshop". After that a specialized organization retrieves precious metals and proceeds with the recycling. The collection of false teeth is free of charge.
